PAKISTAN FLOODS

As devastating floods continue to ravage Pakistan, Development and Peace is urging Canadians to make a donation for these flood victims. Development and Peace has contributed \$50,000 to their emergency relief program but says that it is not enough. Caritas Pakistan, Development and Peace's partner in Pakistan, estimates that at least \$5 million is needed to get water, shelter, food and other emergency needs to people.

Proceeds from this special collection will be forwarded to the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace, giving us the opportunity to help provide immediate support as well as long-term assistance.
